2020/2021 presented us with difficulties that no-one could have foreseen—not just in tenant participation but in our daily lives.

This resulted in things being done somewhat differently than planned, but it also meant that we were unable to achieve everything that is in our strategy. Despite this we have made progress in some areas as you will see from this leaflet. There is also a more detailed document should you wish further information.

We were due to review our Tenant Participation Strategy during 2021/2022, but we felt it would be wrong to move on without completing what we set out to do.

On 16 March 2021 our Board of Management agreed that the current strategy would be extended and reviewed after April 2022.
