Covid—It's Not Over Yet

News this week is that Fife and East Lothian are moving to level 1 as planned but Edinburgh and Midlothian will stay at level 2. This is a stark reminder that covid has not gone away, and in fact at her briefing on Tuesday Nicola Sturgeon said

'The considerable downside that we face just now is the Indian, or April-0.2 variant – which was renamed last night by the World Health Organisation as Delta.....

This variant is spreading faster than previous variants of the virus, and we now believe that it accounts for well over half of our new daily cases. Because of that, Scotland's R number is almost certainly above 1 right now. And, as we know from past, painful experience, that makes our situation highly precarious.....

But it is important to stress that this is a pause, not a step backwards.

And Level 2 is not lockdown. It does have an impact on opening hours of pubs and restaurants and the numbers that can attend certain events. But we can still meet indoors in limited numbers, and outdoors in groups of 8 people from 8 households. Hospitality remains open - indoors and outdoors - and so does retail, and there are no travel restrictions in place. And taking a cautious approach now - while more people get fully vaccinated – does give us the best chance of staying on the right track overall. So to everyone in these areas, please continue to be careful. Follow all of the important guidance on hygiene, distancing and face coverings. Keep getting tested. And come forward to be vaccinated as soon as you get the opportunity.....'

I have heard many stories in the past week from Viewpoint tenant about other tenants not wearing masks in the corridors and not socially distancing sitting in the sun. It appears that some people are assuming that the vaccine makes it alright to do these thinas.

Well it's not!

The vaccine does not give 100% protection from the virus and it is not clear if the virus can still be transmitted by those who have had the vaccine.

1 in 3 people who have coronavirus do not show any symptoms.

At the end of her address to the Scottish Parliament Nicola Sturgeon sums up what we all need to do

'I would ask everybody to please continue to stick to the rules where you live, and follow the public health advice. Physical distancing, hand-washing, face coverings – all of this is still important for now. These basic precautions will reduce our chances of getting or spreading the virus.'

We are still working on the risk assessments around the re-opening of the common areas in our sheltered complexes.

The Scottish Government was supposed to be issuing guidance to supported housing providers on re opening of common areas within sheltered housing sites, but this keeps getting delayed and as yet no guidance has been forth coming.

Whist we totally understand the effect this is having on tenants we have to be mindful that we do not end up with a Covid outbreak within our developments. Gardening Contract Update

We understand that the gardening contract remains of concern to some of you, and there has been some criticism of the new contractor, Glendale, operating in Edinburgh and the Lothians.

The contractor has recently identified the need to put in additional resources, with this being a new contract and the recent sporadic weather patterns, there is a huge amount of work to do to bring the areas back to an acceptable standard. In the short term, the priority has to remain in the critical areas-grass cutting and spraying. Some of the work will not be done until later in the year, due to the sheer volume and, as cutting back some of these items now would be detrimental to their future wellbeing.



We will shortly be producing a printed newsletter to enable all tenants to be updated on the gardening contract and to give you more information on what is due to happen on a regular basis.

D-Day

During World War II (1939-1945), the Battle of Normandy, which lasted from June 1944 to August 1944, resulted in the Allied liberation of Western Europe from Nazi Germany's control. Codenamed Operation Overlord, the battle began on June 6, 1944, also known as D-Day, when some 156,000 American, British and Canadian forces landed on five beaches along a 50-mile stretch of the heavily fortified coast of France's Normandy region. The invasion was one of the largest amphibious military assaults in history and required extensive planning. Prior to D-Day, the Allies conducted a large-scale deception campaign designed to mislead the Germans about the intended invasion target. By late August 1944, all of northern France had been liberated, and by the following spring the . Allies had defeated the Germans. The Normandy landings have been called the beginning of the end of war in Europe.
